



2021 COLLEGE SPORT WELLINGTON GOLF

PLAYING CONDITIONS

This competition is administered by College Sport Wellington and Clubs of the Wellington Golf Association.

Please respect the time and commitment these people voluntarily give to assist with the promotion of this Phillips Cup competition.

The Wellington Golf Association, on behalf of their member clubs, have advised that the privileges of complimentary use of courses for this competition is extended to the College participants only and NOT supervising adults.

1. DAY-DATES

Play is on Mondays, commencing 15 February-22 March with the Final 30 March.

2. VENUES

Teams will play on courses within their zones as identified on the draw

3. START TIME

Play is scheduled to start no later than 4.00pm or earlier if both teams are ready and tees are available.

4, TEAM COMPOSITION & SUPERVISION

Note now teams are to consist of 2 players - mixed or single sex.

It is a condition of play that players may not move from team to team within their School.

Each School must submit their team lists before Round 1

It is a requirement that there be an adult supervisor for each school at each playing course.

5. ORDER OF PLAY

Play is a 9 hole Stableford competition.

The stableford nature of the competition means that play is in fours - 2 players from each college. The School adult or Course Convenors will arrange this.

6. DURATION OF PLAY

Each "foursome" as identified above play 9 holes in the order decided by the host club. Most golf clubs use number 1 and number 10 as starting tees but this can vary.

7. HANDICAPS

At least 1 player in each team must belong to a Golf Club and have an official handicap. The maximum handicap to play off is 36 h'cap for both girls and boys.

This also applies to Non handicapped golfers.

8. SCORING

Each team score will be the aggregate of both the player's stableford points.

The basis of this scoring method is:

The hole done in 1 over par 1 points

The hole done in par 2 points

The hole done in 1 under par 3 points

The hold done in 2 under par 4 points

The hole done in 3 under par 5 points

However the potential points per hole are handicap adjusted.

If a player has a handicap of 36 (the maximum permitted) they are allowed 2 shots per hole over par.

36 handicap players allowed 2 shots per hole over par.

For hole done in 3 over par 1 point

For hole done in 2 over par 2 points

For hole done in 1 over par 3 points

For hole done in par 4 points

For hole done in 1 under par 5 points

18 handicap players - allowed 1 shot per hole over par.

For hole done in 2 over par 1 point

For hole done in 1 over par 2 points

For hole done in par 3 points

For hole done in 1 under par 4 points

For hole done in 2 under par 5 points

For handicaps "under" these examples, adjustments are made. The supervisor at your course will assist players with this scoring method. This point allocation is done at the completion of your play.

NB. Once a player has played more than 3 shots over par for any hole, (4 for girls) -they must pick up their ball and play no further shots on that hole.

9. COURSE OFFICIALS

The Golf Club's official will advise starting hole.

10. DRESS

All players must wear clothing appropriate to Golf and preferably in their school colours. "Beach Wear", jeans, jandals etc are **not acceptable**. Player's dressed in this latter mode will not be permitted to play. **Flat soled shoes should be worn - "nipple - soled" sports shoes damage greens and should not be worn**

11. ETIQUETTE

Players should be reminded/instructed of the etiquette of Golf and behave accordingly on & off the course. Unacceptable behaviour reported will result in that players' suspension from the competition and possibly the forfeiture of competition points.

12. DEFAULTS AND CANCELLATIONS

These must be advised by 12.30pm on the day of play to:

- **the opposing school**
- **the Golf Club scheduled to host the game.**
- **College Sport Wellington**

13. RESULTS

The results must be entered on line by 3pm Tuesday of the week of play otherwise all winning points from that game may be forfeited.

This is the winning schools responsibility; not the host club.

14. POINTS

Winning team - 3 competition points, Losing team - 1 competition point, Default - no points.

15. REGIONAL FINAL

The final of the Philips Cup, will be played between the two top teams from each of the 3 Zones. It will be at Shandon Golf Club on Tuesday 30 March—over 18 holes. If any 2 teams are tied on competition points, then the team to progress shall be the winner of the match between those 2 teams. College Sport may consider exceptions to this rule.

16. REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

The Team and Open Championships are scheduled for Tuesday 16 March -9am at Royal Wellington GC and entry details will be sent out later.
